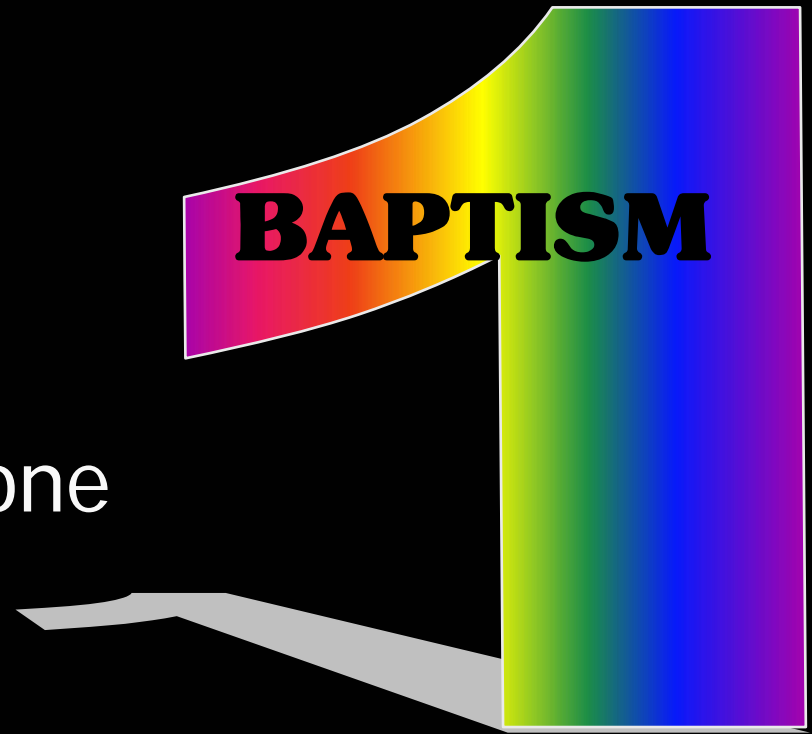

- The only baptism that existed when Paul penned "Ephesians"
- Element is water
 - Eph. 5:26
 - cf. Acts 10:47
- Is done in the "name of the Lord"
 - Acts 19:5
 - cf. Acts 2:38; 8:12, 16; 10:48; Matt. 28:18, 19



- Not Holy Spirit Baptism
 - Acts 19:5, 6
- Not John's baptism
 - Acts 19:3-5
- Administered after one believes in Christ
 - Acts 19:4, 5
- For Remission of sins
 - Acts 2:38; 22:16





BAPTISM

- Christ (Gal. 3:27-29)
 - New creation (2 Cor. 5:17)
- Body (1 Cor. 12:13)
 - Church (Col. 1:18, 24)
- Death (Rom. 6:3-5)
 - Blood (Jn. 19:34)
 - Forgiveness (Col. 1:14)
 - Salvation (Mk. 16:16; 2 Tim. 2:10)



INTO

- Are you “in Christ”?
- Do you want to be “in Christ”?
- Do you accept what Paul taught on how to get “in Christ” (Gal. 3:27)?
- Do you think there is another way “in Christ”?
