- JOHN ALWAYS REFERRED TO SEVENTH DAY AS "SABBATH" (JN. 5:9, 10, 16, 18; 7:22, 23; 9:14, 16; 19:31)
- IF JOHN SPOKE OF THE SEVENTH DAY IN REVELATION 1:10, HE WOULD HAVE CALLED IT THE SABBATH.
- "LORD'S DAY" A NEW TERM FOR A NEW COVENANT (JER. 31:31-34)

**A NEW INSTITUTION
REQUIRES NEW NAMES!**

THE LORD'S DAY **REVELATION 1:10**

OLD COVENANT MADE AT SINAI

"Nothing was in the ark except the two tablets of stone which Moses put there at Horeb. . .and there I have made a place for the ark, in which is the covenant of the Lord which He made with our fathers, when He brought them out of the land of Egypt" (1 KIN. 8:9, 21).

NEW COVENANT NOT ACCORDING TO OLD

(Jer. 31:32).

Old had "Sabbath" New has "Lord's Day"

THE LORD'S DAY **REVELATION 8:10**

**The "Lord's Day" is in reference to the day the Lord arose
(Mk. 16:9)**

- **Lord's Supper NOT O.T. Passover Meal**
- **Lord's Table NOT O.T. "Table of the Lord"
(Mal. 1:7; Ezek. 41:22)**
- **Lord's Day NOT O.T. Sabbath**

"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new"
(2 Cor. 5:17)

"And he that sat upon the throne said, Behold, I make all things new" (Rev. 21:5)
